
Interested in the arts? Are you home schooling?

The Film Challenge is an opportunity for home schoolers to make a short film or animation about any publicly owned sculpture in their area. The Art UK and CultureStreet Film Challenge is a great way to increase your young people's confidence and develop their skills. CultureStreet will provide resources to help you make your film or animation.

What We Are Looking For

This opportunity is open to young people home schooling in just six regions of the UK.

East Midlands

(Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Rutland, Nottinghamshire)

East of England

(Cambridgeshire, Norfolk, Suffolk)

East Scotland

(Perth & Kinross, Angus, Fife, Dundee)

Glasgow and Central Scotland

(Glasgow, West Dunbartonshire, East Dunbartonshire, Renfrewshire, East Renfrewshire, North Ayrshire, Inverclyde, North Lanarkshire)

South Wales

(West Glamorgan, Mid Glamorgan, South Glamorgan, Gwent)

South Central England

(Hampshire & Isle of Wight, Wiltshire, Dorset, Channel Islands)

If you live in one of the above regions why not make a film or animation about a publicly owned sculpture near you. This could be a sculpture outside, in a gallery or other venue eg, indoor shopping centre. **The best film from each region will receive £100 bursary . These will be decided by a panel of judges from Culture-Street and Art UK.**

To take part:

- Your film must be no longer than 4 minutes and must feature a publicly owned sculpture.
- We will provide you with online resources to help you make your film.
- We will support you to select a sculpture if you don't already have one in mind.
- Your film must be completed by **10th December 2020**.

Background Info

Established in 2002, Art UK (previously known as the Public Catalogue Foundation) is a dynamic arts charity with a national and global reach. Between 2003 and 2012 Art UK digitised 212,000 oil paintings from 3,200 locations across the UK. By doing so, Art UK transformed access to the UK's publicly owned art collection, much of which is not on regular display. In summer 2017 Art UK started a project to digitise the nation's sculpture collection.

Supported by a £2.8 million National Lottery grant, Art UK will catalogue the national sculpture collection. This major new initiative will put online the nation's sculpture collection and will include 3D, high and low relief works, figurative and abstract works from approx. the last 1000 years! Around 170,000 sculptures - located inside galleries, museums and public buildings or outdoors in parks, streets and squares - will be displayed on the Art UK website. The aim is to have all works of sculpture uploaded to www.artuk.org by January 2021.

Established in 2012, CultureStreet provides resources for children, young people and adults who work with them to find out more about the arts and have a go at arts activities themselves. CultureStreet has been commissioned by Art UK to support young people to review the nation's sculpture collection. To find out more take a look at www.culturestreet.org.uk
